Chairman's Summary Report for the year 2011

1. Catches

In the 2011 season 1,154 fish were reported as being caught. Previous years catches are shown below.

Previous years: 2010 - 1,714 2009 - 1,295 2008 - 1,186 2007 - 1,335 2006 - 1,265

The catch figure for 2011 marked a return to near average levels following the significantly higher catch of 2010. This is reflected in the fish counter totals below. Following a reasonably encouraging spring run, the grilse run was disappointing.

76% of the fish caught were returned. As in previous years, the Board's recommended Conservation Policy was circulated to all Proprietors. I would encourage all Proprietors to comply with this.

As in 2010, the Kilmorack counter was not fully operational for a period in 2011. Accurate figures are not currently available.

These figures mark a significant reduction on 2010, however it is believed that the average size of the fish running in the river was larger and therefore the cumulative impact on fish spawning would be reduced as the larger hens will lay more eggs.

3. Licences

An interim licence was obtained for the control of piscivorous birds. This licence was organised by Keith Williams in conjunction with the Spey District Fishery Board and was for the period 18 January 2011 to 30 April 2011. The total licence was for two cormorants, both of which were shot.

A licence for 2 mergansers and one cormorant has been received in 2012.

In 2011 the District Fishery had a licence to shoot two common seals and two grey seals under the Moray Firth Seal Management Plan. One seal were shot within the river.

A licence for 2 common and 2 grey seals has been received for 2012.

4. Baillifs

A Warrant Card has recently been issued to Alastair Fraser (Glass), bringing the total number of warranted baillifs in the Beauly District to four. The other three baillifs are: Keith Williams (NBFT)

Robert Smart (Lower Beauly)

An Application has been received from Donald Fraser (Middle Beauly) to be issued a Warrant Card also. Donald has recently completed the IFM Baillif's exam.

A number of minor poaching incidents were attended to in the last year, with one recent arrest taking place on the Middle Beauly. This is now in the hands of the Procurator Fiscal.

5. Ness & Beauly Fisheries Trust

Dr. Keith Williams will update Proprietors on current progress on habitat management and fish genetics at the Proprietors' meeting.
